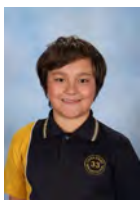
1/2K ~ JIMMY

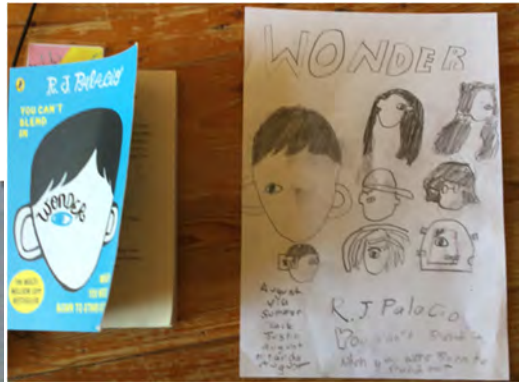
AMAZING TOKYO TOUR

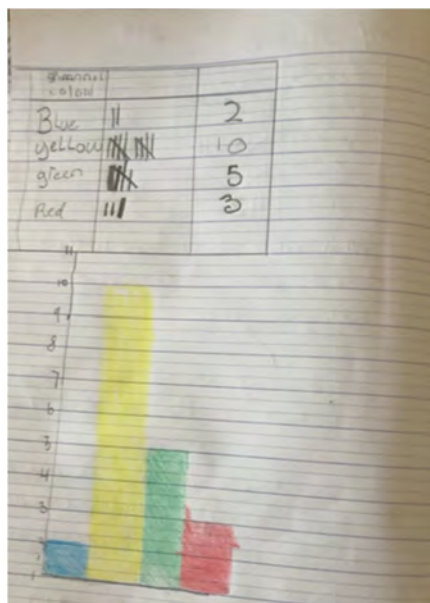
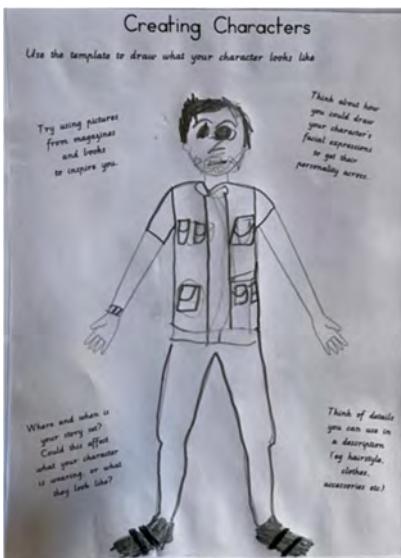

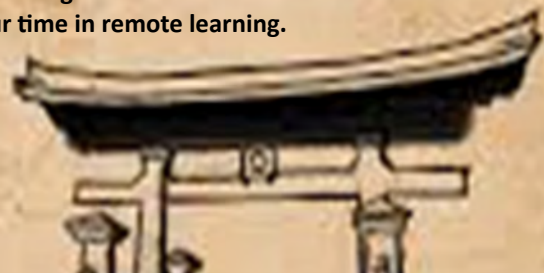
