

Art Room News

The art room has been abuzz with numerous captivating mini projects, engaging students from all grade levels. The students have been introduced to a diverse array of artists, sparking vibrant discussions and thought-provoking exchanges. It is truly enriching to delve into their unique perspectives and opinions when encountering new artists, fostering a culture of artistic exploration and open dialogue.

This week the Foundation students were introduced to Yayoi Kusama, a renowned Japanese artist recognised for her vibrant and lively artwork adorned with polka dots. Affectionately referred to as "The Princess of Polka Dots," Kusama's distinctive style captured the students' attention. To immerse themselves in her artistry, the students utilized a Kusama Cat template and skilfully incorporated multiple circular shapes onto their feline creations, thereby cultivating a sense of captivating repetition.



In grades 1 and 2, students were acquainted with the artist Wassily Kandinsky, who sought to convey his emotions and feelings through art, often employing bold lines and vibrant colours. Encouraged by this approach, each student embarked on their own artistic journey, crafting unique interpretations of Kandinsky's artworks by experimenting with colours that represented their own emotions. At DSPS, we utilise the Zones of Regulation, which categorise emotions into different colours like the yellow zone, green zone, blue zone, and red zone, to express and understand our feelings.



In grades 2 and 3, students were introduced to the iconic artist Andy Warhol, whose works drew inspiration from popular culture. By selecting their beloved subjects, the students emulated Warhol's distinctive style by employing vibrant hues and repetitive patterns, breathing life into their own artworks. The students switched colours around and present a group of prints with contrasting colours together.

Fun fact about Andy Warhol: He made a print of Campbell's Soup – a popular brand of soup in the United States. He said he ate Campbell's tomato soup every day for lunch for 20 years!



More Art Room News

The students in grades 5 and 6 were introduced to Damien Hirst, a prominent English artist renowned for his provocative artworks. Engaging in thoughtful discussions, the students expressed their varied perspectives on his pieces. One student pondered, "I'm uncertain whether I truly appreciate his art or strongly dislike it." Facilitating a platform for art critique proved crucial, as it allowed the students to understand the motivations behind an artist's creations and emphasized the significance of attentively listening to and respecting differing opinions.


